ART.1 – INTRODUCTION

The rally will be run in compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code and its appendices, the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations, the National Sporting Regulations which comply with the FIA regulations and these Supplementary Regulations.

Modifications, amendments and/or changes to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated bulletins (issued by the organiser or the stewards).

The rally will be twinned with a National Event with separate supplementary regulations.

The rally will be also twinned with a motorcycle event (*FIM Bajas World Cup*) with separate supplementary regulations.

Additional information will be published in the Rally Guide, issued on August 7.

In the event of any dispute concerning the interpretation of these regulations, only the English will be considered as binding.

Official time throughout the entire rally will be that of GPS (UTC time + offset to local time).

“Due to the public health situation resulting from the pandemic of the new Coronavirus, Covid-19, and its unpredictable evolution, mandatory measures or restrictions may be established, by the Portuguese authorities, which impose changes to the present Regulation. Any modification, as a result of the aforementioned, will be communicated to the competitors by means of a Bulletin to the Regulation or by information from the Organiser.”

ART.4 – ENTRIES

4.1 Closing date for entries

- With reduced fees: Friday, October 9
- With normal fees: Friday, October 16

4.2 Entry Procedure

Entries must be submitted as specified in Article 16 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

The entry form is available on the organiser's website www.bajaportalegre500.com

In compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code, foreign entrants/drivers must be in possession of the approval of their own ASN, which must be attached to the entry form or produced at the administrative checks at the latest.

With the submission of the entry form, each foreign entrant and/or driver/co-driver declares that he/she is in possession of this authorization.

When the entrant is not one of the drivers, a copy of the valid Competitors license must be attached to the entry form.

The entry application will only be accepted if accompanied by the total entry fees.

4.3 Number of entrants accepted

The maximum number of entries that will be accepted is 110.

If more than 110 entries are received the organiser reserves the right to decide which entries among the non-priority drivers will be accepted.

A copy of the proof of wire transfer must be sent attached to the application form. Please ensure that the entrant's name and account holder are included as reference on all wire transfers.

Any bank charges incurred must be paid by the entrant in addition to the entry fees. Bank checks will not be accepted.

The organiser will reimburse the entry fee to those competitors who were unable to present themselves at the start of the Cross-Country Rally for reasons of "force majeure", subject to the application reaching the organiser per email. The deduction will be:

- 25 % of the entry fees for requests received until 30 days before the administrative checks
- 50 % of the entry fees for requests received until 8 days before the administrative checks

There will always be a deduction of 25% (file fee).

Other situations of *force majeure* not mentioned are subject to analysis and approval of the Organising Committee.

ART.5 – INSURANCE

See Art. 15 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

5.1 The entry fees include the civil liability insurance towards third parties, in accordance with the Portuguese law.

The maximum indemnity per accident is limited to 48 560 000€ or 9 760 000€ in corporal or material damages, respectively.

- 5.2** Competitors are reminded that only damage caused to third parties by the organisers and/or the entered drivers is covered by the insurance policy taken by the Organisation. Injury to the drivers themselves or damage to participating cars are not covered by this insurance.
- 5.3** Entrants and drivers are free to take on at their own convenience any individual insurance policy that they deem fit, independently from the above mentioned liability insurance.
- 5.4** The service vehicles, even those bearing special plates issued by the organisers, may never be considered as official participants in the rally. They are therefore not covered by the insurance policy of the rally and remain the sole responsibility of their owners.
- 5.5** By submitting their entries, the competitors, drivers and car owners waive any claims or rights to pursue action for damages in connection with the event against the organiser.
- 5.6** Automóvel Club de Portugal, as well as the organizing committee, declines all responsibility for all accidents that may occur during the race.

ART.6 – IDENTIFICATION

Identification numbers and plate, as well as compulsory and optional advertising, must be fitted to the car for scrutineering and must be visible for the duration of the rally.

ART.8 – TYRES

See Art. 10 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations, and Art. 10.7.1 of V2 of the same Regulation

- 8.1** After agreement by the FIA, the FIA T1 drivers will be allowed to use a maximum of 10 tyres.

ART.9 – REFUELLING / FUEL

See Arts. 55 and 57 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

- 9.1** The team is responsible for the refuelling.

9.2 Refuelling after Service A (see article 10.4)

After checking-in at TC2C, vehicles may be refuelled;

- at the refuel area adjacent to the service park (see *Appendix V*);
- by the crew, at any fuel station indicated in the road book on the official route using only that station's fuel.

To allow both possibilities, the road book will include two different routes between TC2C and TC2D.

ART.10 – SERVICE

See Art. 50 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

- 10.1** Service is permitted only at the Service Park located at Nerpor (Portalegre).
- 10.2** Only the vehicles with a SERVICE NERPOR or TEAM MANAGER sticker delivered by the organisers will be admitted at the service park. This sticker should be visibly placed on the front windscreen.
- 10.3** As per Art. 50.2.4 of V2 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations, in timed service areas only three personnel may work on a competing vehicle. They shall be identified by the official armbands supplied by the organiser to each competitor during administrative checks.

10.4 Service times

10.5 Car wash

Washing the competition vehicles between TC4A / TC4B will be allowed if carried out by the crew exclusively on the official route at one of the service stations indicated in the road book.

ART.11 – ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

11.1 Location

11.2 Timetable

According to the programme. The exact schedule will be published by means of a bulletin.

At the time of convocation of each team, which will be announced by Bulletin, one of the team members must go to the secretariat to collect the material for the team.

11.3 Time controls

A time control (V1) will be installed immediately before administrative checks.

Any delay at the presentation at this time control will result in the following fines:

from 1 to 15 minutes	150 €
from 16 to 30 minutes	250 €
> 30 minutes	500 €
> 60 minutes	Start may be denied

ART.12 – SCRUTINEERING

12.1 Location

Nerpor (Portalegre).

12.2 Timetable

According to the programme. The exact schedule will be published by means of a bulletin.

12.3 Time controls

A time control (V2) will be installed immediately before the scrutineering area.

Any delay at the presentation at this time control will result in the following penalties:

from 1 to 15 minutes	150 €
from 16 to 30 minutes	250 €
> 30 minutes	500 €
> 60 minutes	Start may be denied

A time control (V3) will be installed immediately after scrutineering.

12.4 When checking in at time control V2, competitors must comply with the following:

- All rally plates, competition numbers and advertising plates must be already fitted in the vehicle
- Sealing holes must have been drilled (according to art. 24 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations)
- Original FIA homologation form and/or FIA Technical Passport
- All items of clothing, including helmets and an FIA – approved head retaining device, intended to be used. Compliance with Appendix L Chapter III
- Produce the Anube STELLA III equipment in working order, fitted permanently to the vehicle

12.5 FINAL CHECKS

The complete original FIA homologation form/FIA Technical Passport and all other necessary certifications/documents must be available for final checks.

12.6 Participants need to pay particular attention to the following changes:

- T3 Minimum Weight: Art. 286.5.1 of the 2020 Appendix J
- T4 "Reference" Vehicle: Art. 286A.2.1 of the 2020 Appendix J
- Fire Extinguisher for T1, T2, T3 and T4: Art. 283.7.1.1 of 2020 Appendix J;
- A crew is made up of two persons for T1, T2, T3 and T4 (Art. 2.8 of the 2020 FIA Cross Country Rally Sporting Regulations)
- Survival Kit: in accordance with Appendix III of the 2020 FIA CCR SR (please see the appendix VII)

ART.13 – BRIEFING

13.1 The briefing will be written and delivered during administrative checks.

ART.14 – STARTING ORDER & INTERVALS

See Art. 32 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

14.1 Starting order after a Qualifying Stage (SS1)

See Art. 33.5 of V2 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

ART.15 – QUALIFYING STAGE (SS1)

See Art. 33 of V2 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

15.1 The qualifying stage is compulsory for all competitors with the whole crew on board.

15.2 Timetable

According to the programme.

15.3 Reconnaissance

According to the programme.

The reconnaissance of the Qualifying Stage is allowed either on foot, by normal bicycle and electric bicycle.

ART.16 – SELECTIVE SECTIONS

See Art. 41 & 42 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

16.1 SS Maximum Time

A maximum time will be given to each selective section. This time will be indicated by means of a bulletin and on the time card.

If the maximum time is exceeded a fixed penalty will be applied.

16.2 Official itinerary

See Arts. 14.2 of V2 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

It is absolutely forbidden, under pain of a penalty that may go as far as disqualification, to drive out of the rally's itinerary described on the road unless in the event of a blockade of the track. If such a case should occur, the crews may pass around the obstacle and return to the track immediately after.

The Clerk of the Course may use the competitors track monitored and recorded by the tracking system to check eventual deviations and especially short cuts. These will be reported to the stewards who may impose penalties at their discretion.

Any attempt to tamper with, to manipulate or to interfere with the tracking device fitted to the competing car or any device that fails to record a trace due to external interference will be reported to the stewards who may impose a penalty up to disqualification.

16.3 Average altitude

The average altitude of the total distance of selective sections of the event is less than 500 meters above sea level.

16.4 Speed Control Zones

See Art. 37.2.6 of V2 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

For the control of these zones the Anube Stella III system will be used. The start of the speed zone control will be indicated in the Road Book by a box marked "SZ" and the maximum speed authorized. The end of the speed control will be indicated in the Road Book by a box marked "FZ". Panels will also be placed at the beginning and end of each zone, together with others informing the maximum allowed speed. These panels are for reference only, have no regulatory validity, the information given by the Road Book will prevail.

ART.17 – TOWING

For safety reasons and whenever possible, the organisers may tow or push any vehicle in order to bring it back onto the rally road or to clear the rally route.

ART.18 – FIXED PENALTIES

See Art. 49 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations, and Art. 49 of V2 of the same Regulation

18.1 Any crew who having started section 1 or 2 fails to complete a selective section of that sections as required by the regulations and particularly within the maximum time allowed to complete that selective section will be given a fixed penalty.

Any crew who having started section 1 or 2 not having started a selective section of that sections will be given a fixed penalty.

18.2 Any crew who has received a fixed penalty on section 1 will be allowed to re-start the rally at the start of section 2 provided that they check in at their scheduled start time.

18.3 Any crew who has received a fixed penalty on section 2 of Leg 1, will be allowed to re-start the rally at the start of section 3 of Leg 2, provided that they check in at their scheduled start time.

18.4 Summary of Fixed Penalties

18.1	Failure to complete a selective section	50% max time + max time of SS
18.1	Not having started a selective section	2 x max time of SS

18.5 To be classified a crew must not have received a fixed penalty on more than 50% of the sections of a rally.

18.6 In no case may a fixed penalty be used by a crew who has been excluded by the Stewards.

ART.19 – TIME CARD

See Art. 6 to Appendix 2 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

Time cards will be issued at the following time controls:

TC0, TC1C, TC2E & TC3D.

ART.20 – CONTROLS

20.1 Time controls

See Art. 38 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

Crews are authorised to check in before time without incurring any penalty at the following time controls:

TC1B, TC2B, TC2C, TC2D & TC4B.

20.2 Passage controls

See Art. 36 of the 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

20.3 Closing time of the passage controls

The closing time of the different passage controls will be calculated as follows:

$$T_n = T_o + T_m + 120 \text{ minutes}$$

T_n: Closing time of the control "n"

T_o: Starting time of the last vehicle

T_m: Maximum time at control "n" calculated on the basis of the distance from the start of the selective section and the minimum average speed established for the same selective section.

For each crew, the calculation of a passage control closing time will be based on the starting time of the crew for that selective section (**T_o**: Starting time of the crew).

20.4 Intersection Controls

Controls will be set up in the intersection with asphalt roads or heavy traffic country lanes. These controls will be signaled as 'CC'.

Crews must respect the signs made by the marshals in post who may show a stop sign, in which case the crew must stop the vehicle before the intersection. Any crew failing to comply will be subject to a penalty at the Stewards discretion.

Any crew presenting themselves at a CC in a direction different from the one in the road book will be penalized as if in a control zone.

ART.21 – REGROUPS

See Art. 39 of 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

In the regroupings between TC1B / TC1C and between TC3D / TC3E the minimum stopping time for each crew will be 10 minutes.

ART.22 – FINISH PROCEDURES

22.1 The rally will finish at TC4B. From this point on all cars are subject to Parc Fermé rules until the Parc Fermé is opened at the instruction of the stewards.

22.2 The podium ceremony will take place near the HQ. The following crews will be required to attend the podium ceremony:

- Highest classified national crew
- T4 / T3 / T2 / T1 winners
- Finishers in general classification 3th to 1st

In the event a car is not driveable for the above procedure, this must be reported to the Clerk of the Course and the crew members concerned must still attend the podium finish ceremony.

22.3 Equipment

When attending the podium ceremony, crews must wear the FIA approved overalls.

22.4 Provided that the results have become final and the stewards have authorised the Parc Fermé to be opened, all cars must be removed from Parc Fermé at the latest by 23H00 on Saturday, November 7.

Only upon presentation of the Parc Fermé pass issued at TC4B may a car be removed from the Parc Fermé by the drivers or their representatives.

ART.23 – RECONNAISSANCE

See Art. 28 of 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

The area of the event is defined by the counties of Alter do Chão, Arronches, Avis, Coruche, Crato, Fronteira, Gavião, Monforte, Nisa, Ponte de Sor, Sousel and Portalegre.

Competitors who wish to perform tests are obliged to notify the organisers of their intention, with details of dates/timing and obtain written permission. On request, competitors will be informed about areas where tests are permitted.

ART.24 – COMPETITOR SAFETY (EQUIPMENT OF THE CREWS AND OF THE VEHICLES)

See Art. 48 of 2020 FIA Cross-Country Rally Sporting Regulations.

ART.25 – IDENTIFICATION OF OFFICIALS AND MARSHALS

The officials and marshals will be identified as follows:

- **Competitor’s relations officer:** red tabard with the words “*COMPETITOR’S RELATIONS OFFICER*”
- **Scrutineer:** black tabard with the words “*SCRUTINEER*”
- **Timekeeper:** blue tabard with the words “*TIMEKEEPER*”
- **Post Chief:** blue tabard with the words “*POST CHIEF*”
- **Parc Fermé marshal:** yellow tabard with the words “*COMISSÁRIO DE PARQUE*”
- **Post Chief of the Parc Fermé:** orange tabard with the words” *POST CHIEF*”
- **Marshals:** yellow tabard with the word “*MARSHAL*”



ART.26 – PRIZES / PRIZE-GIVING

For security reasons, related to the rules in force in Portugal resulting from the situation of Covid-19 Pandemic, the delivery of prizes in person will not take place. The new procedure will be informed by Bulletin.

IMPORTANT

For the functional test and verification, all vehicles must have through the installation of the mount, power cord, and antennas.

1. POWER CORD

- Connect the red wire to the positive end of battery 12V (+), and the grey wire to the negative (GRD). The power cord must be connected directly to the battery (without interruptions and without contact in the power supply).

- A 3A fuse (not included) should be connected to the red wire.

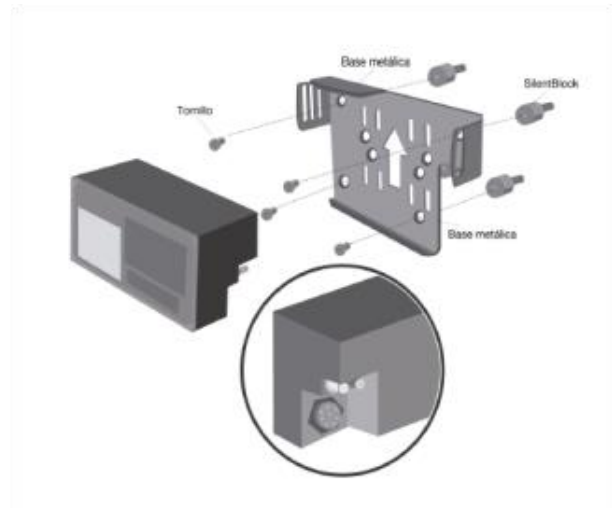
- Take the cord to the location in which the STELLA III EVO is to be installed. All other wires must be insulated, they cannot touch



2. BASE / MOUNT

ATV: The mount can be attached to the handle bar or to a metal plaque close to the navigation system.

- Car and SSV: The mount can be attached to the panel, or to the roll cage bars. STELLA III EVO buttons, must be visible and accessible to the participant (pilot/navigator) even when they are sitting and with the seatbelts buckled.



IMPORTANT

Leave the cords (antenna and battery) in place with at least 10 cm to spare for easy handling.

At least 5 cm of space behind the mount (bottom right corner) to allow space for power cord/connections.

3. GPS ANTENNA

- The GPS antenna must be installed horizontally and without obstructions toward the sky. In cars and SSV, it can be mounted on the roof, the hood, or the dashboard. In ATV, attach to the mudguard. For additional firmness, it is recommended to cover it with adhesive tape (non-metallic when mounting it to a metallic surface) and pull-up (when attached to soft or plastic parts).



4. IRIDIUM ANTENNA

The Iridium antenna must be installed horizontally and without obstructions toward the sky. In cars and SSV, it can be mounted on the roof, the hood, or the dashboard. In ATV, attach to the mudguard. For additional firmness, it is recommended to cover it with adhesive tape (no metallic when mounting it to a metallic surface) and pull-up (when attached to soft or plastic parts).



5. GPS ANTENNA

The radio-frequency antenna must be installed vertically to the roll cage bars (cars and SSV) and the forks (ATV). It is mandatory to use separators (included in the kit) to avoid contact with metallic parts and the carbon fibre that surrounds it.

Once the antennas are mounted, take the SMA connection cords to the base/mount where the STELLA III EVO will be installed.

APPENDIX VII – THE SURVIVAL KIT COMPRISES THE MEDICAL AND SURVIVAL EQUIPMENT

A. MEDICAL EQUIPMENT

- 1 x rescue scissors or 1 x pair of stainless steel scissors 14.5 cm
- 1 x adhesive plaster tape 5 m x 2.5 cm
- 6 x sterile compresses 10 cm x 10 cm
- 1 x roll of conforming elastic self-adherent bandage Coban type or equivalent - 4 m x 8 cm
- 2 x rescue sheet - aluminium blanket minimum 160 cm x 210 cm, which can also be used to signal using the sun.
- 2 x finger plasters 12 cm x 2 cm
- 4 x pairs of disposable nitrile gloves (adult size)
- Wet wipes
- Minimum 4 single doses of physiological saline for eyes
- 1 x skin disinfectant (50 ml)
- 2 x compression bandages: emergency haemostatic compression pad
- 1 x tourniquet (one-handed operation) – CAT or similar
- 1 x information sheet
- 1 x emergency procedure sheet
- 1 x critical burn kit for face and hands – Water-Jel or equivalent
- 1 x 50 ml sunscreen
- 1 x headlamp
- 1 x emergency mirror

B. SURVIVAL EQUIPMENT

- 1 x reflective triangle
- Seat belt cutters accessible when belted into seat
- 2 x motorcycle or working goggles (with a soft edge to the face)
- 2 x safety vest
- 1 x safety light (flashing torch), Powerflare® or similar
- 1 x towing belt
- Warm clothes and shoes if the race is taking place in temperatures below 5°C
- 2 x lighter
- 1.5 litres of non-alcoholic beverages per person with CamelBak tubes and mouthpieces or similar, to facilitate drinking during the race.”
